

## Logging FTD Instruction Time

- Time in a Flight Training Device (FTD) may be logged as "Flight Simulator or Synthetic Trainer." If you have a blank column, consider creating a dedicated column titled "Flight Training Device" or "FTD."
- Many logbooks also have a column called "Dual Received". The FAA refers to this as "Instruction Received" on the 8710-1. FTD instruction received may also be logged in this column.
- Remember, FTD time cannot be logged as "flight time" and therefore does not belong in the "Total Flight Time" column.
- Use the following table as a reference when logging FTD training under Part 142. **The FAA certification number should be entered in your logbook where the aircraft N-number is typically placed.**

ERAU FTD	FTD Level	FAA Cert. Number	A/C Model
F6	Level 5	<b>5778-001</b>	PA-44
F7	Level 6	<b>0858</b>	PA-44
F8	Level 6	<b>0886</b>	C-172
F-9	Level 6	<b>0887</b>	C-172
F-10	Level 6	<b>0885</b>	C-172

**Note:** If you are using the "ERAU FTD" number in your logbook, you may continue to do so. Labels with the above matrix are available on the second floor of F-6 and should be placed in the back of your logbook.
